She is historian in residence in the Department of Bioengineering at Imperial College London, and a Research Fellow in the Division of Surgery within the Department of Surgery and Cancer.

Her research examines the medical, social and religious history of medieval France and England, especially the region of Normandy. Her publications include *Leprosy and Charity in Medieval Rouen* (2015).
